

## Chapter 12.08

### OBSTRUCTIONS\*

12.08.010 Permit required. It is unlawful for any person, to place or maintain any obstruction whatever, upon any of the streets or sidewalks of the town without permission therefor in writing first had and obtained from the chief of police or from the town council as provided in this chapter. (Prior code §3400).

12.08.020 Time limit and renewal of permit. In case a permission be granted, as provided in Section 12.08.010, such permission shall be granted for not exceeding thirty days, and shall, after the lapse of such time be void. The chief of police may designate the extent of such obstruction in such permission. The person maintaining the obstruction, may, after the lapse of the permission from the chief of police, apply to the town council for a renewal of the permission so as to continue the obstruction. (Prior code §3401).

12.08.030 Renewal permit. The town council may grant or refuse such renewal as they may think proper, consistently with the public interest or convenience, and may limit the extent of the obstructions and the duration thereof. (Prior code §3402).

12.08.040 Lighting of street obstructions. During the time the obstructions exist, under permission as provided in Section 12.08.010, the person maintaining the same shall, from five-thirty in the evening of each day to six-thirty a.m. of the following day, during the months of November, December, January and February, and from six-thirty in the evening of each day to five-thirty a.m. of the following day, during the other months of the year, cause to be maintained lighted lanterns hung upon each side of the obstruction so as to lighten the same and thus prevent the obstruction from becoming dangerous to life or property. (Prior code §3403).
