Octagon House Celebrates 150 Years

The Octagon House, iconic home of the Moya Library-Ross Historical Society, celebrates its Sesquicentennial anniversary September 19, 2014. Located in the Marin Art & Garden Center, the eight-sided historic structure was built 150 years ago by the daughter of James Ross



and her husband, George Worn, to serve as a temporary home while construction on their 21 acre Sunnyside estate was completed.

In 1882, Jonathan and Harriet DeWitt Kittle acquired Sunnyside. The main house was substantially expanded and the Octagon House converted into an elegant billiard room for Mr. Kittle. In 1931, a fire severely damaged the family residence and the heirs demolished the improvements, however the Octagon House and the livery stable, today home to the Ross Valley Players, were left standing.

The Sir Francis Drake Boulevard (SFD)/Lagunitas intersection improvement project is nearly completed with a few outstanding items still to go. The Council approved amending the project to install an additional concrete sidewalk from the bus stop location (in front of MAGC) to Laurel Grove Avenue. We

The Town of Ross is blessed with an abundance of trees, a lush, organic landscape, and vistas of the surrounding hills and Mt. Tam. When the Town Council considers residential development or approves public works projects, we do so with the goal of enhancing, or, not detracting from, the beauty of the Town.

At this month's Council meeting the Council reviewed a design plan to landscape the median area located on Sir Francis Drake, just before Bolinas Avenue. The proposal is to landscape the median with native plants consistent with those you see in the median in Kentfield and Greenbrae. The SFD/Lagunitas pedestrian safety improvement project was undertaken during the summer months, when many residents were away. The work enhanced pedestrian and ADA access around the the SFD/Lagunitas intersection, and included repaving SFD, replacing the traffic signals, and improving the flow of traffic in front of Town Hall. New lighting and a new landscaping area was also added in front of Town Hall, and soon, new wood signs will be installed to replace the existing Fire and Police sign and to identify Town Hall. This work continues the Town's commitment to residents to provide safe pedestrian and traffic access and quality roads.

In October, the Council will review seismic studies of Town owned buildings in the aftermath of the Napa earthquake. We encourage all residents to review their family disaster plan and to consider volunteering as a Block Captain for the Town DISCO (disaster preparedness) program. A Message from the Ross Valley Fire Department



Wildfire season has officially arrived in Northern California as evidenced by the recent fires in Napa and Solano Counties. High temperatures, low humidity,

winds, and low

fuel moistures lead to exponential fire growth which quickly over-run local resource capabilities. The Ross Valley Fire Department is a signatory of the California Master Mutual Aid Agreement and participates in the Office of Emergency Services (OES) engine program. As such, the Department is responsible for responding to mutual aid requests with the OES fire engine and personnel. The department has responded to two incidents this fire season already.

Ross Street Addresses Added to Post Office Database

We are happy to report the U.S. Post Office (USPS) has added the physical street addresses of 645 addresses in Ross to their database. Ross does not have mail delivery, and as a result, Ross street addresses have not been recognized in the USPS database (in the past), making it challenging for residents to receive packages from carriers such as FedEx or UPS, and challenging for mapping a street location in Ross.

The Ross Property Owners Association had requested the Town look into this matter. Congressman Jared Huffman's office was contacted and assisted in getting the USPS to agree with the Town's request. As a result, the USPS has revised the information in their mail database. The database now includes both the PO Box and physical address for 645 addresses in Ross. The USPS reminds residents that with this change, mail is still only delivered to the PO Box (not the physical address). For vendors who require a physical address such as FedEx, residents should use the following four-line format:



1) Sir Francis Drake at Bolinas Avenue Median Landscaping Project was awarded to Gardeners' Guild, the lowest responsible bidder, in the amount of \$50,907.08.

The median island just south of Bolinas Avenue will receive new landscaping and existing water service and electrical connections will be re-established. The project is expected to



commence in early October, pending Marin Municipal Water District approval.

2) 2014 Roadway Improvements Project was awarded to Maggiora & Ghilotti, Inc., the lowest responsible bidder, in the amount of \$129,129. The streets scheduled for repaving are Ames Avenue (from Shady Lane to the cul-desac), Canyon Road (from Winding to approx. 200' from Laurel Grove), and portions of Upper Road (between Glenwood and Woodhaven). The project will be completed before the end of October 2014. ■

ROSS - ARE YOU PREPARED FOR AN EARTHQUAKE?

Last month, moments after our region was struck by a 6.0 magnitude earthquake near Napa, most of us were fortunate not to have experienced any damage or injury. But in Napa and Vallejo, the damage was severe - with estimates already reaching \$1 billion and approximately 200 people injured.

If this earthquake affected Ross, would you:

- > Have an evacuation plan and know what to do, once you were required to evacuate?
- Know how to contact your family and friends?
- > Have food, water, medicine and other supplies for at least 72 hours for you, your family and pets?

What can you do to prepare?

➤ Take a Get Ready Class – Ross Valley Fire Department will be re-launching an improved Get Ready program next month during October Fire Safety month. Classes will be announced on their website in October at <u>www.rossvalleyfire.org</u>.

➤ Take a Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) course - this I6-hour course provides training to the community to assist immediately after a disaster occurs until the arrival of professional rescuers. Go to www.readymarin.org to register.

Octagon House Celebrates 150 Years - continued from page 1

When the Kittle heirs sold the property to the Marin Art & Garden Center in 1945, the Octagon House was in a poor state of repair. For the next several decades it was used for storage, although in the mid-1960s, the Pathfinders' Guild served soups and salads in it to raise funds in support of the Center.



In 1968, the Marin Art & Garden Center wanted to honor Ross resident and acclaimed artist, Jose Moya del Pino, for his contributions as one of the driving forces

that founded the Center and for serving as an original Trustee. Funded with a substantial donation from Moya's wife, Helen, the Octagon House was moved to its present location and placed on a new foundation. The original tongue and grove walls were restored and a handsome balcony and spiral staircase were added. Upon completion of the restoration, the Octagon House became the Moya Library and a supporting guild was formed. The library collection is limited to works relating to art, gardening and local history, with many of the original volumes from the personal collection of the Moya del Pino family. The Ross Historical Society was established in 1982 and originally had its offices at the Town Hall. The two organizations consolidated in 1994. Today the Octagon House serves the community as the Moya Library-Ross Historical Society.
