## **Jump Start Your Vegetation Clearing**

Spring has arrived in our beautiful town and already the vegetation – both wanted and unwanted, is sprouting up uncontrolled in our front yards and along our roadways. Per Ross Municipal Code Section 12.12.010, it is the responsibility of all occupants and owners of property within the town to trim, remove or destroy all trees, hedges, plants, shrubs or vegetation, which obstructs or impairs the free full public use of the sidewalk area or street in front of their premises. Here are some guidelines to stay in compliance:

- I) Remove all grass, weeds, shrubs, bushes, trees or vegetation growing, or which have grown and died upon property which are a fire hazard or menace to public health, safety or welfare. A tree permit may be required for tree removal (see Municipal Code Chapter 12.24 for tree regulations).
- 2) Branches of trees shall not be permitted to extend lower than seven feet above the surface of the sidewalk area or to extend lower than thirteen feet six inches above the surface of the portion of the street used for vehicular traffic, whether planted in the sidewalk area or upon private property.
- 3) Flowers, shrubs and other growth, with the exception of trees, in the sidewalk area shall not be permitted to exceed eighteen inches in height.

# **Council Approves New ADR Member Selection Process**

On March 9, 2017, the Council adopted a resolution to amend and establish new ADR policies and procedures. One of the changes associated with the amended policies and procedures is that the composition and the size of ADR Group members was reduced from nine active members to five members, of which four members would be design related professionals and one member would be a non-design related professional. The Council directed staff to provide options for the member selection process at the April Council meeting.

Given the sensitivity of having to reduce the ADR Group and in order to reconcile the current appointments per the amended policies and procedures, staff presented the Council with three options to consider: I) Allow ADR members Fritts and Kemp to continue their appointments to February 2018 when they are set to expire. The remaining ADR members whose appointments expire in June 2017, would apply to the Council to fill the remaining three vacancies until February 2018. 2) ADR Group members self-select off to obtain a final count of five (there was not a consensus among ADR Group members for this). 3) Council disbands current appointments and Town-wide application and interview process

4.	Council appoints new ADR Group members.	June 8, 2017
5.	New ADR Group appointments effective.	July 1, 2017
6.	Current ADR Group members would remain on the ADR until June 28, 2017	June 28, 2017
7.	ADR Group special meeting for training relative to new policies & procedures.	June 12-July 20
8.	First ADR Group meeting with new appointments.	July 25, 2017
