In what seems to be an ever-continuing parade of construction activities, in preparation for the Bolinas Avenue drainage project, PG&E, the Marin Municipal Water District (MMWD) and the Ross Valley Sanitary District each will be relocating facilities to accommodate the work. They started work this week.

MMWD is anticipated to begin in April replacing nearly one mile of old fire flow deficient pipe with new 8-inch and 6-inch pipe on Baywood Avenue, Crest Road, and Wellington Avenue.

The County is starting work on traffic signal synchronization on Sir Francis Drake Boulevard extending from the 101 intersection to the Eastern boundary of our Town. This is expected to ease the journey by reducing congestion and speeding up travel. We shall see.

Marin County Supervisor Katie Rice will be visiting our post office on Friday

April 26 from 8:30 to 10:00 am to meet with any resident who wants to talk with her. If you haven't experienced Katie's friendly, down-to-earth approach to the issues that concern us all, this is the ideal way to do so--while picking up your mail.

Farm Stand Returns in May

The Farm Stand, operated by Jim Baum, will begin its fifth year on the Ross Common on Thursday, May 2nd (weather permitting). The seasonal farm stand will run every Thursday, May through October, from 11:30 am to 7:30 pm.

The Farm Stand has been in Marin County since 2003, and represents the cooperative efforts of over 20 Marin Organic Farms from the communities



of Bolinas, Inverness, Lagunitas, Nicasio, Point Reyes, San Anselmo and Tomales. The variety of their produce is a wonderful reflection of the local micro climates, and speaks of the local expertise of family run farms. The Farm Stand features seasonal, local and organic produce and products, pasture raised eggs, baked goods, local artisan foods, natural and pasture raised grass-fed meats (beef, pork, and lamb) and wild, line-caught locally sourced seafood.

Mr. Baum operates a permanent Farm Stand in Forest Knolls at 6700 Sir Francis Drake Boulevard, Thursday thru Monday, and will also be in downtown San Anselmo on Fridays May through October. Design Guidelines Update

Town ROSS

The Town of Ross, with the help of the Town's consultant, Winter & Co., is in the pro-



cess of developing Design Guidelines. The purpose of the Design Guidelines is to implement a General Plan implementation planning project to promote excellent design for residential development. Specifically, the

Design Guidelines are expected to provide architectural and design related information, set expectations, and provide guidance/suggestions to residents, design professionals, and prospective residents regarding topics such as building scale, building location, site design, building materials, and landscaping. The Ross Town Council, the Advisory Design Review Group (ADR Group), and Town staff will also use the Design Guidelines to review and evaluate development applications to ensure any development would be in keeping with the tenets of the General Plan.

The Town has been conducting an iterative public process that has included two public workshops. The first workshop was held May 8, 2018. The Town's consultant provided a presentation and attendees participated in four activities that were crafted to provoke thought and community input on what is important to the Town relative to its look and feel. Based on the results of the May workshop, Draft Design Guidelines were developed. The second public workshop was held March 26, 2019. This workshop introduced the release of the Draft Design Guidelines and was intended to provide a community dialogue to elicit input. The Town's consultant provided an overview and explanation of how to apply and use the Draft Design Guidelines.

What is important to know about this review process is that *it is not too late to review the Draft and provide* your comments (e.g., is the document easy to use, do you agree with the design concepts that characterize the Town, are there missing design concepts?). Your input and feedback is critical to the creation of the Design Guidelines to ensure remodels and new residential development are compatible with the existing built environs. MMWD RATES PROPOSAL

The Marin Municipal Water District (MMWD) will hold a public hearing on Tuesday, May 28, 2019, at 7:30 pm (220) Nellen Avenue, Corte Madera) to consider proposed increases to the water service rates, fees and charges. The public is encouraged to attend. MMWD is notifying property owners subject to the proposed increase and water customers of the proposed changes.

The proposed rate changes include two main components:

- 1) An increase to the water use and fixed charges on your bimonthly water bill, averaging a 4% annual revenue increase, to keep pace with inflation and fund MMWD's ongoing operations and maintenance.
- 2) A new Capital Maintenance Fee (CMF) to fund investments in critical water system projects for clean, reliable water; projects to reduce wildfire risk on Mt. Tam; and may be used to fund debt service on existing and future capital projects. The annual CMF will be between \$163 to \$246 for most homes.

Each year the District evaluates its infrastructure needs, programs, and operations and maintenance costs for the ensuing fiscal year. The District hired an independent rate consultant to determine how best to recover projected operating and maintenance costs over a five-year period and projected capital and wildfire management costs over a 10-year period. Based on this evaluation, the District has determined that rate increases are necessary to: recover current and projected costs of operations and maintenance, including increases in purchased wholesale water; fund capital improvement infrastructure improvements needed to provide safe and reliable drinking water; maintain the operational and financial stability of the District; manage wildfire risk on watershed lands; and avoid operational deficits and depletion of financial reserves.
