Mayor's Corner



I am sure that you have read about the terrible fire tragedy on Maui and thought about how well our community is prepared for a fire and for evacuation. It is super important that every resident is signed up for AlertMarin to receive notifications for emergen-

cies. While the Town of Ross has an emergency siren, its main purpose is to alert residents of potential flooding and the siren cannot be heard throughout the entire Town. To receive emergency notifications please sign up for these free services: Alert Marin, Marin County Office of Emergency Management, Register at: https://emergency.marincounty.org/pages/alertmarin; and to Nixle register by texting your zip code to 888-777. Registering with Alert Marin and Nixle will ensure that emergency response and evacuation information is sent directly to your cellphone and is tailored to the type of emergency underway.

ing Firewise or becoming a Neighborhood Block Captain. Please go to Fire Safe Marin at firesafemarin.org if you want more information about joining an existing Firewise neighborhood group (Ross has two Firewise groups: one on Woodhaven; the other in Winship Park) or starting a new one in your neighborhood. Information about hardening your home, defensible space and vegetation management to prepare for wildfires and other valuable information is also available at Firesafemarin.org and at the Marin Wildfire Prevention Authority at marinwildfire.org.

For those of you who do not have the Ross School calendar handy, the start of school was Tuesday, August 22nd. Ross Back to School Night will be held on September 7th. Recognizing Paul Stromoski, 20 years with the Town of Ross

Paul grew up in LA and joined the U.S. Army two weeks after high school graduation. He was stationed in Germany for four years, and after discharge, returned

to Germany to live and work . He returned to CA to attend UC Davis, graduating with a B.A. degree in foreign language and linguistics.

While working in Sonoma in the international wine trade full-time, Paul worked part-time for CA State Parks and became a CA State Park Ranger after completing CA peace officer training. He worked at Folsom Lake State Recreation Area. He transferred to the Town of Ross Police Dept after four years, when his wife Anna's career brought them to the Bay Area.

Fire-Smart Tips from the UC Master Gardeners

SEPTEMBER: Maintaining a Fire-smart Land-scape

- Continuously clear dead leaves, branches, and debris from around your home, especially from your roof and gutters.
- Maintain a clearance of 10 feet between tree limbs and your chimney, and 5 feet from the rest of the home.
- Regularly prune trees and shrubs to remove dead branches and increase space in tree canopies to reduce flammable fuel.
- Remove low-hanging branches from trees to create space between lower vegetation to reduce the risk of fire ladders.
- Keep vegetation from overhanging or touching power lines.
- Remove any dead vegetation and dry grasses from the landscape to reduce potential fuel.
- Regularly inspect plants for drought stress and water appropriately to keep plants healthy.

MMWD Truck Traffic Starting 9/5/23

MMWD made a presentation to the Ross Town Council on 8/24/23 about their upcoming truck hauling project through the Town of Ross beginning on September 5th and continuing every weekday through October 3rd.

Twenty to thirty trucks a day will be hauling dirt from MMWD's Pine Mountain Tunnel Tanks Project through Ross, from Natalie Coffin Greene Park, down Lagunitas Road to Sir Francis Drake Blvd, then down Sir Francis Drake Blvd toward Highway 101.

The Town has coordinated the truck activity with MMWD so that conflicts with Ross School and Preschool drop off and pick up will be minimized. For more information on the project, visit MMWD's project website here.

WILDLIFE IN OUR OWN BACKYARD!!

At the recent Bald Hill plaque dedication ceremony, Julie McMillan encouraged Rene Voss to share a short wildlife video with the Ross Town Council, which highlighted some of the iconic wildlife in the heart of Ross. The wildlife camera was placed for 10 days on Upper Toyon Ridge.

Rene Voss is a Natural Resources Attorney and Executive Director of the Western Alliance for Nature (WAN). He manages the Upper Toyon Ridge Nature Preserve, which is a northern spotted owl sanctuary, owned and held in trust by WAN. WAN considers its lands to be held in trust for public benefit; and education about conservation is part of it's mission.
